OFFICIAL PROCEEDINGS OF THE LAMOURE COUNTY BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS MEETING-Tuesday, October 17th, 2023

At 8:30 am Chairman Robert Flath called the meeting to order and opened by reciting the pledge of allegiance. Commissioners: Jason Weigel, Keith Heidinger, Lee Miller, and Bruce Klein were also present. Also attending were James Shockman, State's Attorney; Jan Hamlin, Auditor; Darrick Nitschke, Highway Superintendent; Bryan Tykwinski, KLJ; and Art Hagebock, LaMoure Chronicle. Attending virtually was DES/911 Coordinator, Kimberly Robbins.

Chairman Flath called for additions to the agenda. There were no additions. Comm Heidinger made a motion to approve the agenda with no additions, seconded by Comm Klein. All voting aye, motion carried.

Chairman Flath called for a review of the October 3rd, 2023, commissioner minutes. A motion was made by Comm Klein to approve the minutes, seconded by Comm Weigel. All voting aye, motion carried.

Highway Superintendent, Darrick Nitschke, brought to the board further information on the road grinder. Darrick provided more knowledge on the reclaimer and some benefits to having one. There is a solution that can be added into the reclaimer and as it does its job it injects this solution into the road that helps with dust control and hardening the roads. Having a machine of this power, would be more time efficient, since it would be able to complete a mile a day. A down payment of \$1,000 will lock in our price with delivery this fall. This machine would also fall under the Flexible Transportation Fund Program. Comm Klein made a motion to purchase a reclaimer, seconded by Comm Miller. Roll call vote: Comm Weigel-yes; Comm Heidinger-yes: Comm Miller-yes; Comm Klein-yes; and Chairman Flath-yes. All voting aye, motion carried.

Highway Superintendent, Darrick Nitschke and DES/911 Coordinator, Kimberly Robbins have requested the engineering contractor, KLJ, make a revision request to FEMA on DR 4660 -PW 56 for a Corrugated Metal Pipe (CMP) option that has potential for significant savings from the original box culvert request. Comm Miller made a motion to contract with KLJ to make this revision request, seconded by Comm Heidinger. All voting aye, motion carried.

KLJ, Bryan Tykwinski, shared with the board that the biggest take way with the NDACo conference was the Flexible Transportation Fund Program. It's a reimbursement program. Applications will be due by the end of the year.

DES/911 Coordinator, Kimberly Robbins, presented to the board the progress of DR-4717. The county is down to the final review. LaMoure County submitted 76 sites in 9 townships. The plan is to sign off with the State and send to FEMA on Thursday. Kimberly also shared that she has a meeting today with the City of Marion on Boom Lake to review current elevation; plan for resources for this fall/winter; and let them know the meeting date with the LaMoure County Water Resource Distrist has not been set.

NDSU Extension Service, Julianne Racine & Torie Piehl, gave their quarterly update. The annual plot tour was a hit with excellent turn out, around 80 attendances. Julianne also updated the board on different pest investigations, and Torie Piehl's recent promotion. Torie, then presented to the board 4-H kids update. 4-H enrollment is going well and the program has welcomed five new families.

Tax Director, Denice Porter, presented to the board a letter from the North Dakota Office of State Tax Commissioner that LaMoure County needs to decrease residential property values 2% versus 4% that was originally done to be in compliance with state guidlines. Comm Weigel made a motion to decrease the residential property value 2%, seconded by Comm Heidinger. All voting aye, motion carried.

The board set minimum sale price on delinquent tax property with included the estimated 2023 taxes and the cities requested specials. Parcel number 35-1307101 located at 204 1st Ave SW
