OFFICIAL PROCEEDINGS OF THE LAMOURE COUNTY BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS MEETING-Tuesday, November 21st, 2023

At 8:30 am Chairman Robert Flath called the meeting to order and opened by reciting the pledge of allegiance. Commissioners: Jason Weigel, Keith Heidinger, Lee Miller, and Bruce Klein were also present. Also attending were Jan Hamlin, Auditor; Darrick Nitschke, Highway Superintendent; James Shockman, States Attorney; Trent, Butler Machinery and Art Hagebock, LaMoure Chronicle, attending virtually Kimberly Robbins, DES/911 Coordinator.

Chairman Flath called for additions to the agenda. There was one addition, approval of the November 7th park board meeting minutes. Comm Heidinger made a motion to approve the agenda, seconded by Comm Miller. All voting aye, motion carried.

Chairman Flath called for a review of the November 7th, 2023, park board minutes and commissioner minutes. A motion was made by Comm Klein to approve park and commissioner minutes, seconded by Comm Weigel. All voting aye, motion carried.

Highway Superintendent, Darrick Nitschke, presented to the board a blade quote from Butler Machinery and John Deere. A new blade will take up to a year to get keeping our current machine under warranty. This purchase would be replacing Jud's 2016 blade with 9,400 hours. Getting a new Caterpillar would run \$314,850 if we use our old attachments, get all new attachments would be an additional cost of \$20,770.

Darrick informed the board that the grinder arrived last week. Darrick also came across a promotion with the dust pods, Polymers. They are currently running until the end of the year buy a mile get a mile for free, matching up to twenty miles for the price of ten miles. The cost runs from \$5,400 to 5,500 per mile, depending on how thick this product is applied.

Lastly, Darrick brought to the board's attention that being short the 2003 Mack semi that was totaled out earlier this fall has put the Road behind where they want to be because of their only working with one semi. Darrick had asked the board to replace the semi with the suggestion of using the funds from the insurance claim and auction profit.

DES/911 Coordinator, Kimberly Robbins, presented to the board an update on the Multi Hazard Mitigation Plan. Kimberly has received participation letters from all cities within the county as of November 20th. All steps have been completed and Kimberly will be submitting the grant.

NDACo Joint powers agreement was reviewed by James Shockman. Comm Weigel made a motion to agree to sign the Joint Powers Agreement with NDACo for the service of collection and distribution of 9-1-1 fees, seconded by Comm Miller. All voting aye, motion carried.

Tax Director, Denice Porter, presented an omitted tax for parcel number 40-0103020. It was a residential building value omitted in the 2021 appraisal. The individual did not come to their hearing to object. Comm Klein made a motion to add property to the taxes, seconded by Comm Heidinger. All voting aye, motion carried.

Sheriff, Robert Fernandes, presented to the board the Cass County Attendant Care Agreement, 2024 Stutsman County Correctional Center Contract, and Burleigh Morton Detention Center Contract. Comm Heidinger made a motion to approve the 2024 Stutsman County Correctional Center contract, seconded by Comm Miller. All voting aye, motion carried. Comm Weigel made a motion to approve the Burleigh Morton Correctional Center contract, seconded by Comm Klein. All voting aye, motion carried. Comm Klein made a motion to approve the Cass County Attendant care agreement, seconded by Comm Miller. All voting aye, motion carried.

Sheriff Fernandes also presented the 'Back the Blue' grant that we've received which is approximately \$5,700. This grant can be spent on retention, recruiting, or tuition and fees. Sheriff Fernandes would like that grant money to go toward reimbursement of tuition and fees.

The commission received two beer and liquor license applications. Comm Heidinger made a motion to approve Edgeley Splickan beer and liquor licenses with Sunday sales, seconded by Comm Klein. All voting aye, motion carried. Comm Miller made a motion to approve City View beer and liquor licenses with Sunday sales, seconded by Comm Heidinger. All voting aye, motion carried.

NDDOT Maintenance Division, Brad Darr and Jay Presks requested to be on the agenda today to discuss the State Limited 129,000 Lb. large truck network. Agtegra Cooperative's request is for US Hwy 281 from the South Dakota border to the US 281/I-94 interchange in Jamestown and ND Hwy 11 from the junction of US Hwy 83/ND Hwy 11 to the junction of US Hwy 281/ND Hwy 11. The request affects the counties of LaMoure, McIntosh, Dickey, Stutsman, and Emmons. They would like to know if the commission has any concerns that need to be brought back to their advisor committee. At this time the commission doesn't have any concerns. Edgeley City Mayor, Cal Triepke, was also in attendance.
