## OFFICIAL PROCEEDINGS OF THE LAMOURE COUNTY BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS MEETING-Tuesday, May 21st, 2024

At 8:30 am Chairman Jason Weigel called the meeting to order and opened by reciting the pledge of allegiance. Commissioners: Keith Heidinger, Lee Miller, Bruce Klein and Robert Flath were present. Also attending were Jan Hamlin, Auditor; Darrick Nitschke, Highway Superintendent; Fallon Kelly, State's Attorney; Bryan Tykwinski, KLJ; and Art Hagebock, LaMoure Chronicle. Attending virtually was Kimberly Robbins, DES/911 Coordinator.

Chairman Weigel called for additions to the agenda. There were no additions. Comm Miller made a motion to approve the agenda as presented, seconded by Comm Heidinger. All voting aye, motion carried.

Chairman Weigel called for a review of the May 7<sup>th</sup> 2024, commissioner minutes and April 16<sup>th</sup>, Park Board minutes. A motion was made by Comm Klein to approve both the commissioner and park board minutes, seconded by Comm Flath. All voting aye, motion carried.

Highway Superintendent, Darrick Nitschke, received a call with concerns regarding a box culvert near Jud. It's seventeen feet long and is failing. It is located on 77<sup>th</sup> Ave. The walls are coming loose and gravel is falling into the water. Bryan with KLJ and Darrick plan to go look it over to see what options to fix or replace may be available.

The road department is coming along on CR 34 with reclaiming. Darrick ended up leasing a compactor since the county was unable to perform at the capacity needed. Darrick also brought to the board's attention concerns with CR 60 and what they should do with the road next year. Comm Klein made a motion to have 12 miles of hot in-place asphalt recycling done on CR 60, seconded by Comm Flath. All voting aye, motion carried. Comm Heidinger made a motion to award Knife River the bid on CR 35 to US Highway 281, seconded by Comm Flath. Roll call vote: Comm Heidinger-yes; Comm Miller-yes: Comm Klein-yes; Comm Flath-yes; and Chairman Weigel-yes. All voting aye, motion carried.

Bryan Tykwinski with KLJ updated the Board on the bridge projects. Construction road limits have been set and going to start the right-of-way process. The market analysis for Adrian came back at \$5,000 an acre and Grand Rapids \$4,500 an acre. Comm Flath made a motion to proceed with the right-of-way purchases for the Adrian and Grand Rapids bridges with up to \$5,000 an acre, seconded by Comm Miller. All voting aye, motion carried.

States Attorney, Fallon Kelly presented the USDA grant which will cover up to \$45,000 in funds for the Gladen Construction, road damages. Roads will have to be done by June 30<sup>th</sup>.

DES/911 Coordinator, Kimberly Robbins, returned the topic of the State Homeland Security Grant Program FY2024. The due date to apply is June 5<sup>th</sup>. Comm Heidinger made a motion to apply for getting security cameras at Memorial Park with the State Homeland Security Grant, seconded by Comm Klein. All voting aye, motion carried.

Comm Heidinger made a motion to approve Progress Enterprises, Inc. for Horseshoe Saloon gaming site permit, seconded by Comm Flath. All voting aye, motion carried.

Comm Flath made a motion to appoint Bob Fernandes as the LaMoure County Coroner through the end of the year, seconded by Comm Miller. All voting aye, motion carried.

Auditor, Jan Hamlin, gave an election update. As of yesterday, the Auditor's office has mailed out 702 ballots and has received 250 back. The office is now running tests on the election equipment and will be holding a public test June 3<sup>rd</sup>.

Comm Heidinger made a motion to pay the bills presented, seconded by Comm Flath. All voting aye, motion carried.
