## OFFICIAL PROCEEDINGS OF THE LAMOURE COUNTY BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS MEETING-Tuesday, August 20<sup>th</sup>, 2024

At 8:30 am Chairman Jason Weigel called the meeting to order and opened by reciting the pledge of allegiance. Commissioners: Keith Heidinger, Lee Miller, Bruce Klein and Robert Flath were present. Also attending were Jan Hamlin, Auditor; Darrick Nitschke, Highway Superintendent; Brandy Rolland, State's Attorney Paralegal; Art Hagebock, LaMoure Chronicle, Bryan Tykwinski, KLJ. Kimberly Robbins, DES/911 Coordinator; attended virtually.

Chairman Weigel called for additions to the agenda. The addition was JDA (Job Development Authority). Comm Heidinger made a motion to approve the agenda with the addition, seconded by Comm Flath. All voting aye, motion carried.

Chairman Weigel called for a review of the August 6<sup>th</sup> 2024, commissioner meeting minutes. Comm Flath made a motion to approve the minutes, seconded by Comm Klein. All voting aye, motion carried.

Highway Superintendent, Darrick Nitschke, updated the board on what the road department is doing. Yesterday, the crew began grinding on CR 35 for patching. The crew has roughly eight working days left on CR 34 to get to Highway 281 for the first part of the process. The road department is looking to get a new salt and sand storage building. Darrick estimates the building will pay for itself within 3 to 4 years. Knife River will be starting Thursday on the Jud Road project paving from 6:30 am to 7:00 pm. The next project location to consider is from Highway 281 to Nortonville, a 2-mile quote was \$390,000 with a 2½" overlay. This quote has increased from what was originally projected. Since the abolishing property tax is on the November ballot, the commissioners decided to wait.

Comm Klein made a motion to have the truck speed limit 35 MPH on CR 63 from Highway 13 to Highway 46, seconded by Comm Flath. All voting aye, motion carried. Lastly, CR 34 stop signs are on order.

DES/911 Coordinator, Kimberly Robbins, presented the annual tower inspection. The county owns the tower but rents the land from Larry Harmsen. It has Titan and City of LaMoure property on it. The State's Attorney sent a letter on 5/4/22 informing Titan and City of LaMoure of the tower capacity and that it may fail as well as the "gratuitous agreement". The annual income to the county is \$400 and expenses are \$2,960. The income is not supporting the costs. At this time the commission has tabled the topic for the next meeting. Kimberly updated the commission on the James River releases. The Jamestown Reservoir is releasing 150 CFS, Pipestem 700 CFS. We will continue to see higher river levels till they have fully evacuated the flood storage. September 17<sup>th</sup> is the Pipestem informational meeting.

The motion was made in a previous meeting to get a time keeping system. In order for this system to function properly, the county will have to go to one payroll schedule. At this time the employee has a choice of monthly or semi-monthly. The payroll schedule will now change to semi-monthly to accommodate the new time keeping system.

Rory Metz has a quarter of land in the Jud Fire District and he would like to change it to the Gackle Fire District. A letter was sent to the Jud Fire District where they had a special meeting and approved the change. The percentage is less than .01% with a dollar value of \$96.11. A public notice will go in the official newspaper and the hearing will be at the next commission meeting.

Future meeting dates were set for: October 1<sup>st</sup> and October 15<sup>th</sup>, November 7<sup>th</sup> and November 19<sup>th</sup> and; December 3<sup>rd</sup> and December 17<sup>th</sup>.

The commissioners approved two mills for the JDA during the preliminary budget meetings. After some discussion on forming a board and what it will all take to get the process started, Comm Miller made a motion to remove the JDA from the budget, seconded by Comm

Heidinger. Roll call vote, Comm Heidinger- yes, Comm Miller- yes, Comm Klein-yes, Comm Flath- no, and Chairman Weigel- no. Motion carried.

## Break

Comm Heidinger made a motion to pay the bills presented, seconded by Comm Miller. All voting aye, motion carried.
