

LaMoure County Memorial Park Information & Policies

The LaMoure County Memorial Park campground will open one weekend before Memorial Day weekend and close the 3rd week of October in a normal year. (Weather and flood events may change this.)

Most electric pedestals contain one 50-amp circuit, two 30-amp circuits, and one 20-amp circuit so they can accommodate up to 4 campers.

The park kitchen, canteen, auditorium, cabins, and park caretaker's house are all available for rent. Contact the LaMoure County Auditor's office for availability and to make reservations.

Contact the park manager at this phone number (701) 210-2097 for all campground registration requirements and questions.

NOTE: Nonpayment of camping site fees, or failure to follow park camping policies, will result in the disconnection of electricity at the pedestal and may result in permanent banishment from camping at the park. No person may destroy, deface or remove in any manner any property belonging to the park to include trees, plants or cultural resources. Anyone in violation of any park policies may be asked to leave the park, and forfeit all camping or rental fees already paid.

The following camping and park use policies have been established by the LaMoure County Commissioners and LaMoure County Memorial Park Board:

SEASONAL CAMPING

1. Current rates are \$900 per season per camper. Each site includes water and electricity but not a sewer. A free sewer dumpsite is located in the park. The season runs from the second weekend before Memorial Day through October.
2. All seasonal campers are required to register with the Auditor's office for site approval. Payment is required by April 1st for returning seasonal campers and before parking a camper at a site for new seasonal campers. 3. Electricity will not be provided until payment is made in full.
4. Seasonal campers are permitted in designated seasonal camping areas only sites 25 through 46, 52-55, 65, and 66 are designated as seasonal campsites.
5. No seasonal campers are allowed on sites 1-24 or 56-59, which are designated for weekend campers.
6. No partial prorated payment for seasonal camping is allowed.
7. A maximum of 32 total seasonal campers are allowed at the park. After the limit of 32 is reached there is a waiting list on a first-come-first-served basis.
8. Seasonal camping electrical pedestals are considered at capacity when two seasonal campers are using one pedestal.
9. Open pedestal electric hookups in seasonally dedicated camping areas must be made available to short-term and weekend campers at all times (mostly during holiday weekends and special event weekends when park camping can reach capacity.) All efforts will be made so campers can co-exist for those weekends.
10. Seasonal campers can share their electric pedestals with family/friends as weekend or short-term campers. Regular nightly rates will apply to these campers.

11. Returning seasonal campers have priority for reserving the next season over those who did not seasonally camp. Registration with the Auditor's office is required. If this is not done by April 1st your site will be forfeited to those on the waitlist.

WEEKEND CAMPING

1. Currently rates are \$30 per night per camper and \$20 per night per tent. All primitive camping or tents must be approved by the park manager. Prior to camping payment and registration are required at the registration box located across the street from the park house and shop.
2. Electric pedestal sites 1-24 and 56-59 are designated as weekend camping sites.
3. A weekend is considered Thursday night through Sunday night.
4. Weekend camping sites are on a first-come-first-served basis.
5. Camping groups of three or more campers can reserve, especially encouraged for holiday weekends.
6. All sites marked "reserved" are not available.
7. Groups of 3-4 campers are expected to share one electric pedestal whenever possible (depending on the electrical requirements of campers, etc.)
8. Weekend camping single and double campers can expect to share an electrical pedestal with others, especially on holiday weekends and special event weekends when the campground approaches capacity. Please share the park!
9. All weekend campers deciding to stay for more than one weekend or more than 4 nights must register with the park manager for site approval. After one weekend and more than 4 nights stay, you will be considered a short-term camper. Nightly fees remain the same at \$30/night/camper and \$20/night/tent.

SHORT-TERM CAMPING

1. Short-term camping is camping for more than one weekend, camping during the work week, or camping for 4 or more consecutive nights. Rates are the same as weekend camping rates which are \$30/per night per camper and \$20/per night per tent which must be paid prior to camping.
2. All short-term campers including primitive and tents are required to register with the park manager for site approval.
3. Short-term camping is allowed (when available) in the weekend dedicated camping area (sites 1-24) when approved by the park manager for up to 10 consecutive nights. This may not be possible over holidays and special event weekends.
4. There will be a limit on short-term campers (when all seasonal sites and overflow sites are filled.) Overflow sites are 47, 48, 50, 51, 63, and 64.
5. No short-term camping for more than 30 days is allowed without approval from the park manager (and is subject to site availability.)

NOISE

Please be courteous to your camping neighbors. At no time may the noise at the park create a disturbance or interfere in any way with other camper's enjoyment of the park. Quiet time is 11PM to 7AM.

USE OF GOLF CARTS AND ATVS

Use of golf carts and ATVs on park grounds by anyone without a driver's license is prohibited. Golf carts and ATVs must remain on paved roads and not exceed 10 mph speed limit.

FIRES AND FIREWOOD

Fires are allowed in fire rings and grills only. Do not leave fires unattended, put out all fires before leaving and before retiring for the night. Park staff will collect fire ashes DO NOT dispose of on the riverbank or in the dumpsters. Please do not burn garbage, plastic, glass, cans, or other recyclable items. Due to the Emerald Ash borer LaMoure County is a quarantined county thus any wood brought into the park must remain in the park. The penalty for removing wood from the park is a \$5,000 fine.

WASTEWATER

Please collect and dispose of dish and handwashing water at a sanitary dump station or in a campground toilet. Do not dump gray water on the ground.


OTHER

Owners must clean up after their animals. Dogs must be leashed at all times.

Fireworks are allowed except during burn restrictions.

Hunting or shooting of any kind is not permitted within park boundaries.
